



**Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Council
of the Municipality of Bifrost-Riverton**

In the Province of Manitoba, held on Wednesday, July 6, 2022
Commencing at 4:00 PM in the Council Chambers at 329 River Rd. Arborg, MB

1. CALL TO ORDER

Reeve Johnson called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM.

2. GENERAL BUSINESS

Councillor Andersen requested two subject matters be taken into consideration, with all members of council present and unanimously agreement, to adding the items 2.3 and 2.4 to the Special Meeting agenda.

2.1 High Water Levels

Councillor Andersen presented a map to the Council indicating high Lake Winnipeg levels effecting four properties, with the request for the municipality to take responsibility for creating new diking and water movements around and through the area owned by Her Majesty The Queen's located with the legal description of DESC NW 34-21-4E.

Councillor Klym requested for the Council of the Municipality of Bifrost-Riverton to lobby the Provincial and Federal governments to make amendments to the Agri-stability program. *Council deferred to Unfinished Business to the regular scheduled meeting of Council on July 14, 2022.*

2.2 Current DFA Claim

Reeve Johnson requested an update from Mike Boissonneault, WSP on the current Disaster Financial Assistance recovery efforts.

Reeve Johnson then opened the special meeting to an open forum with multiple local construction contractors present to ask questions and make statements to both Council as a whole and Mike Boissonneault of WSP from 4:35 pm until 5:20 pm.

2.3 Roadside Mowing

Councillor Andersen requested the Municipality amend it roadside mowing program to commence in July rather than the planned August 2, 2022 start date.

Council directed Mike Boissonneault of WSP that they want roadside mowing to occur on identified DFA sites prior to aggregate repairs being made.

2.4 In-house Gravel Inventory


Councillor Andersen requested Council reconsider the volumes of allocated Ward gravel amounts within the authorized 54,000 yds³ for 2022.
